Instead of burying Rachel in the most respectful place (which probably would have been in Hebron at our ancestral burial site), Jacob simply buried her at the roadside. 
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When Jacob speaks to Joseph near the end of his life, he reveals that he had a good reason, and hints that Joseph may have resented, for like 50 years, an assumption that Jacob simply didn't respect Rachel enough to bury her properly. Joseph doesn't deny this. So why did Jacob wait so long to tell his beloved son? Why not assure Joseph years earlier that he loved and respected Rachel, and buried her where he did out of necessity? Why let Joseph carry that burden for so many years?

Had Jacob revealed this info to Joseph, he would have had to tell Joseph about the bitter exile that would take place. In order to understand the importance of Rachel's burial spot, it would have been necessary to reveal just how serious the exile would be. Jacob chose to let Joseph resent him for so many years rather than pain Joseph with the knowledge that his descendants would go through such pain.

PARSHAS **VAYECHI- The End of** the Beginning

- IACOB IS 130 YEARS OLD WHEN HE ARRIVES IN EGYPT. , AND HE LIVES THERE AN ADDITIONAL 17 YEARS.
- JACOB WANTS TO BE BURIED IN ISRAEL, IN THE ANCESTRAL BURIAL GROUND OF HIS FAMILY, THE CAVE OF THE PATRIARCHS, IN HEBRON. IN HEBREW THAT'S PRONOUNCED CHEVRON, NOT TO BE CONFUSED WITH ANY GAS STATIONS OF THE SAME SPELLING. HE HAS JOSEPH MAKE AN OATH TO BRING JACOB FOR BURIAL IN ISRAEL.
- JACOB THEN BLESSES JOSEPH'S SONS, MENASHEH AND EFRAIM. THERE ARE TWO UNUSUAL THINGS ABOUT THIS BLESSING. FIRSTLY, THEY ARE BLESSING. GRANDSONS, NOT SONS, SO THE FACT THAT HE GIVES THEM INDIVIDUAL BLESSINGS IS QUITE UNUSUAL AND SHOWS THE SPECIAL REGARD HE HAS FOR JOSEPH. SECONDLY, HE GIVES THE GREATER BLESSING TO EFRAIM, DESPITE MENASHE BEING THE OLDER SON. AGAIN, ACOB SHOWS THAT HE'S MORE CONCERNED WITH WHO DESERVES THE BLESSINGS THAN THE BIRTH ORDER.
- THE EWISH PEOPLE HAVE ADOPTED THIS BLESSING AS ONE TO GIVE TO OUR CHILDREN: "MAY GOD MAKE YOU LIKE EFRAIM AND MENASHE." IT'S STILL USED TODAY.
- JACOB CALLS ALL OF HIS CHILDREN TO HIM, AND GIVES HIS FINAL WORDS. MOSTLY, THESE ARE IN THE FORM OF BLESSINGS, PINPOINTING THE STRENGTHS AND TALENTS OF EACH SON. HOWEVER, THE


MESSAGES JACOB GIVES TO HIS THREE OLDEST SONS, REUBEN, SIMON AND LEVI, SEEM MORE CRITICISM THAN BLESSING.

- JACOB DIES AND IS EMBALMED, TO PRESERVE HIS BODY. THIS MAY BE BECAUSE THAT WAS THE ACCEPTED EXPECTATION IN EGYPT. SOME COMMENTARIES PROVIDE OTHER REASONS WHY JOSEPH WOULD HAVE HAD HIS FATHER'S BODY EMBALMED, WHICH SEEMS TO GO AGAINST STANDARD EWISH PRACTICE.
- AFTER GIVING THE NATION OF EGYPT SOME TIME TO GRIEVE FOR THE LOSS OF JACOB, HIS SONS AND A LARGE PROCESSION BRING JACOB'S REMAINS TO ISRAEL TO BE BURIED IN THE CAVE OF THE PATRIARCHS, THE SAME SPOT HIS PARENTS AND GRANDPARENTS ARE BURIED, AND WHERE HE HAD BURIED HIS WIFE, LEAH.
- THIS SPOT CAN STILL BE VISITED TODAY (THOUGH THERE'S A LARGE BUILDING BUILT OVER THE CAVE) AND MANY PEOPLE GO THERE TO PRAY.
- AFTER JACOB'S PASSING, THERE'S SOME TENSION. THE TEN OLDER SONS OF JACOB WORRY THAT JOSEPH WILL ACT AGAINST THEM IN REVENGE FOR WHAT THEY HAD DONE TO HIM MANY YEARS EARLIER.

JOSEPH ASSURES THEM THAT HE HAD NO INTENTIONS OF

- BROTHERS SWEAR THAT WHEN THE EWS WILL EVENTUALLY LEAVE EGYPT THEY WILL CARRY HIS REMAINS TO BE BURIED IN ISRAEL, JUST AS HIS FATHERS
- JOSEPH DIES AND IS PLACED IN A COFFIN, BUT NOT ACTUALLY BURIED, AWAITING THE DAY WHEN THE JEWS
