He could say bad things should happen to you and they would come true! So anyway, the Moabites hire Billy to do some cursing, and long story short, he tries and fails to curse the Jewish people. Somewhere in the story we missed a talking donkey (yes, this came out before Shrek), his leg getting crushed, and Billam falling asleep over his dinner. God would not allow Blllam to curse the Jewish people. In fact, Billam, was compelled to BLESS the Jews! Partially as a result of this, male descendants of Moab are forever forbidden to marry into the Jewish nation, which is a fairly serious consequence.

Moab also never got to compete in any figure skating competitions.

Wait, who said anything about figure skating?

I dunno, but now that we're on the topic, I want to tell you about two of the best American figure skaters in the early 1990s:

Nancy Kerrigan won the bronze medal in the 1992 winter olympics, and the silver medal in the world championships, cementing her as one of the best skaters in the world. Tonya Harding was another spectacularly successful figure skater. She was the first American woman to land a triple axel in competition, won the 1991 US championships and medaled in the world championships. Yet she was not quite as good as Nancy Kerrigan, and she desperately wanted to win a gold medal. Couldn't they have been safe had they asked Billam to BLESS them instead? But that wasn't on their minds. When facing an adversary,, their first instinct was to tear down someone else, rather than to build themselves up. We can simulate what might have happened had they hired Billam to bless them. They would have gotten a blessing, we would have avoided them, and all would have lived happily ever after. Oh, and perhaps Moab would not have had a marriage restriction put upon them. Moab and Harding, when faced with an obstacle, decided to tear that obstacle down, rather to try and build themselves up.

Challenges are a normal part of life, and sometimes they come in the form of a person or group with whom you are competing. How you deal with that says a lot about you. You can be like Moab, and try to destroy others, or you can work harder, smarter, better and try to improve yourself. Chances are you'll thrive, as you prove your mettle, and medal without metal.

A brief summary of the weekly Torah porshon

PARSHAS BALAK

Billam makes a donkey of himself

- As the Jews travel toward Israel, some of the neighbors start getting nervous
- Balak, a powerful local king, makes an alliance with Midian, a country that was pretty mid. Yawn.
- They hire this guy named Billam known for his powerful curses, but who was actually a really high level prophet, on par with Moses in his prophecy. He probably also had an epic beard. I made that up, but it's probably true.
- Billam keeps asking God for permission to go curse the Jews and as you might've guessed God does not give him permission
- He begs so much that eventually God gives in, telling Billam he'd give him a lollypop if he stopped wailing in public. "You can go with these men, but you'll only be able to say the words I put in your mouth."

- God constantly gives Billam ways out to make a better choice, getting his donkey in a traffic jam, injuring his leg, sending an angel and generally making it difficult to go
- At one point it's getting so ridiculous, the donkey actually talks to Billam. He doesn't change his mind and continues along to meet Balak and curse the Jews.
- It doesn't work out the way he wants. God causes Billam to prophetically bless the Jewish people several times, getting Billam fired by his boss, and he goes home embarrassed and donkiless.
- Moab (Balak's nation) doesn't give up. They use the most effective method of attacking the Jewish people, getting us to sin.
- Many Jews are encouraged to worship a truly bizarre idol called Ba'al Peor, introduced to them by Moabite women. "Jacob, I'd like you to meet my weird god. Weird god, this is Jacob. No need for a handshake." A plaque breaks out and thousands die
