You put your arm around Elijah's shoulder (which if you think about it is really disrespectful- shame on you) and whisper conspiratorially (for those who don't goodly know Englishness, that means like you're telling a secret), "I have a good excuse. God can't bother me about Torah learning."

"Hmmm, why not?"

You continue to whisper, but a bit louder... "Because I'm not very smart. I can't study Torah. I just don't have the brain for it. Besides, I'm totally ADHD."

"You sure you're not smart enough to study Torah?"

"Yes. I'm confident in my limitations. I could never understand the complexities of Torah study."

"Realllly..." the prophet drawls. "Tell me, how do you catch your fish? You just sidle up to the river and reach inside with your hand?"

"No way!

There's a lot of hard work involved. I have to use nets, but the nets from Temu are all the wrong size, so I weave my own nets!"

"Not at all. I first grow my own flax, then comb it, spin it, mark it with a 'B', then I use a complex weave I learned, using a netting gauge, attach the lead line and the float line, design a trawl winch... it's really complicated. You probably wouldn't understand."

Elijah smiles and sighs. "You see my son? You are intelligent enough to plant crops, spin thread, trawl, crawl and whatever else you do. You are certainly smart enough to study Torah."

While I may have slightly changed some of the words, that's pretty much a real conversation that took place between the prophet Elijah and fisherman. There are a few really cool lessons here.

Fishermen use something called a trawl winch. Never knew that.

This fisherman thought that he couldn't study Torah because he wouldn't properly understand it. So

what?

Who ever said you have to be a super scholar to study? Yet it's very difficult to work at something day after day without a feeling of success. The fisherman thought he wouldn't be successful in Torah study so therefore he didn't even try. How often do we do the same thing, giving up on doing great things because we think we won't be good enough.

Elijah's message to him is powerful. If you can succeed at anything, you can succeed at Torah. Torah has power steering.

Erm... What do I mean by that?

One of my kids asked me recently why it's easier to turn a car's steering wheel while you're driving than when you're parked. I explained that there's something called power steering which helps you turn the wheel, because let's face it, cars are really heavy, and it's not easy to turn a wheel under a 4,600 pound minivan. The power steering mechanism helps you along. Even if you're not super brilliant, when you start to turn the wheel,' the Torah itself powers you along.

Dear Huron Camera,

What would you do if there was one day when you could do whatever you wanted?

I mean complete immunity. No consequences, nobody could get hurt, you were unable to get arrested, bullied, criticized, detained, expelled, fined, grounded, held accountable, implicated, jailed, killed, lambasted, misunderstood, nagged, ostracized, policed, questioned, rebuked, shouted at, told- off, undermined, vilified, whipped, Xhorted, yelled at or made to feel like a zero... for anything you do. How would you act? If you knew that God's cameras and microphones were all shut off for 24 hours. How would you act? If police, parents and school faculty would not and could not bother you or get you into trouble for anything you did.

Hey, you're getting way too excited. Calm down! This is hypothetical, Okay?

and all the other good values we believe in. Why? If we know something is wrong, we'd stop ourselves, right? No. We wouldn't.

People need accountability. In every school, every office and workplace, every family, there are certain rules and consequences. The reason for this is that even if we know something is right, we still act in a totally different way if we know someone is watching. Ask any adult who drives. When you see a cop while driving, you suddenly drive more safely, slowly and responsibly. DON'T YOU BELIEVE IN BEING SAFE AND RESPONSIBLE? Even without the police nearby? Of course! Yet having someone pay attention makes us want to work harder to succeed.

An uncaring god would NOT bother with punishing or rewarding us. We would be ignored. The reason God pays close attention and REACTS to our actions is because God loves and cares about us.

You might not go all crazy and start robbing banks, but let's be honest. If there was no accountability, and no consequences, we would act different. We would be less careful with other people's feelings and property. We wouldn't concern ourselves quite as much with doing the right thing, caring, time management, honesty, hard work

11. There's a system of reward and consequences. We will get awesome reward for doing what we should, and uncool results when we mess up.

Aside from knowing that our deeds are put in the database, we need to know that crime doesn't pay. We need to understand that if we do the right things, blessing will follow, and if we aren't careful, we might cause ourselves harm.

12. There will be an end to our long exile. A great leader (Mashiach) will come, and can come at any time.

It's not enough to know that there are rewards for out good deeds (Here, have a candy). This core reminds us that if we earn it, there will be a time period of incredible perfection and joy in the world. The dream and promise of Mashiach has kept Jews going through tough times for thousands of years.



Most of our Dvar Torah articles are based on the weekly Parsha, so we're including this as a weekly segment, giving bullet points of what happens in the Parsha of the week. With some side comments thrown in. Enjoy and please give us feedback!

Partial Partia -Nitzavim- Vayelech Last Will and Testament

- On the very last day of Moses' life, he calls all the Jewish people together for a gathering, to reinforce the deal between God and His people. Everyone is there, from the leaders to the children
- We are all given responsibility for one another's actions. Every Jew needs to feel obligated for the success of every other Jew
- Nevertheless, we're only responsible for the things we can know about. We don't have to read people's minds. Hey, I wonder... what if a mind reader is illiterate?
- The Torah guarantees that even if the Jews will be spread to the four corners of the Earth (which we kind of are), will will eventually be gathered in to Israel
- We are given the choice between life and death and we're advised (commanded?) to choose life
- Moses gives encouragement to his successor, Joshua, telling him to be strong
- Moses writes a Torah and gives it his tribe, the Levites
- Time to convene the convention. In the year after the Sabbatical year, all Jews gather in Jerusalem. Men, women and children all show up to hear a portion of the Torah being read
- The final commandment in the Torah is given. It's the commandment to write a Torah scroll
- A Torah scroll was placed inside the holiest part of the Mishkan, either inside the Holy Ark or on a shelf right beside it


