Yet, a Kohein's job was hardly full time. In fact, do you know how long each Kohein was on duty in the temple every year? Just two weeks!

Two weeks!

I mean, even members of Congress work at least 120 days a year. 2 weeks!

Why can't a Kohein tend his ranch, plant his


