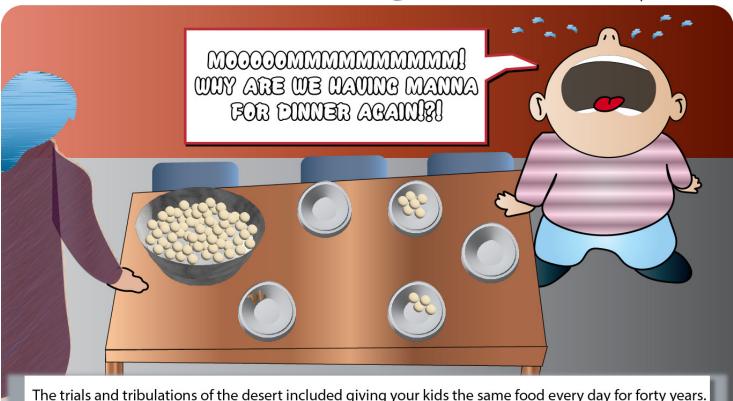

know what Coca Cola tastes like. Thank you, bartender."

I get questions from people all the time. That's why we have Stump The Rabbi. It's really important that questions get answered. It's important that the questioners know that there are good answers to their questions, too. Sometimes the answers aren't enough, and sometimes the questions are too much. Are we overthinking it? Like you, plenty of people gain information from answers, but it doesn't necessarily satisfy them. What do I mean?

Explaining how God works, where the soul is, the reasons for mitzvos or proving the historic truth of the Torah- it's a bit like trying to explain how coke tastes to someone who hasn't tried it yet. It might make some sense, but it'll make a ton more sense once you've tasted it. My advice for those who ask is this: Try it. Taste the Toran. Taste the Mitzvos. Make them a part of your life and then you'll be able to much better understand the answers to all questions.

Just like when you try to learn a new board game; reading instructions will only get you so far, until you actually start to play it.
